CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

- Preheat oven to 375°F. Stir together
 23/4 cups all-purpose flour, 1 tsp
 baking powder, 1 tsp baking soda
 and 1/4 tsp salt.
- 2. Beat 2/3 cups melted salted butter, 2 cups lightly packed brown sugar, 2 eggs and 2 tbsp hot water in a large bowl until smooth. Add flour mixture; beat well. Stir in 11/2 cups Chocolate Chips. Drop by tablespoon onto ungreased cookie sheet.
- 3. Bake 8 10 minutes. Let cook. makes about 4 dozen cookies.
