Two cups semi sweet chocolate chips One can Eagle Brand milk One tsp. vanilla A pinch of salt

First, spray a nine-inch pan with vegetable spray and line with parchment paper.

Melt the chocolate chips in your microwave and stir until smooth. Add Eagle Brand milk, vanilla and salt and stir well.

Pour the mixture into a prepared pan and spread it out to the corners, and then chill until set.

A closer look at the many benefits of a bath lift

As we have so much medical equipment available for our clients to borrow, it's important to zero in on particular items that can make a profound difference in a client's day-to-day life.

Take the bath lift - something that can help make taking a bath a safer experience for a person dealing with a particular injury or mobility issue.

A bath lift is a powered device connected to a domestic bathtub. Bath lifts elevate and lower the user in and out of the bath.

As mentioned, bath lifts are most often used by individuals or caregivers to help a person with limited mobility when it comes to using their bath.

"Hydraulic bath lifts are made for those who have issues getting in and out of the tub," explained Brenda Radu, TLC's volunteer coordinator.

First off, the device is simply placed in the tub - and they are adaptable to most bathtubs, she said.

"They kind of work like a scissor lift. You charge up the battery and push the button (to start the rising motion). It will rise up to the level of the tub, and then you just sit down on it and it lowers you into the water," said Brenda, adding that a requisition from a physician is necessary for a client to borrow a bath lift.

"This is a piece of equipment that we consider to be specialized," she said. "They are just so handy for seniors or for anybody that has any kind of a mobility issue."

The lifts, which can also be relatively pricey to purchase, also have a reclining feature to provide a bit more comfort as well.

"We have between 15 to 20 available to borrow at any given time. And they are in high demand. Those who borrow them want to keep them forever because they are such a great thing!"


