In the meantime, our staff and volunteers are thrilled to be able to spread the word about this exciting new fundraiser!


"It takes just a simple purchase of a ticket, but it can have a great impact here in our community," explained TLC's Executive Director Lori Shatto.

As to TLC's board, David noted that the experience is also helpful to him as it's a terrific way to further his own development.


"It's very interesting to see how a board operates and how it works," he added.
