THOUGHTS FROM THE CHAIR

Pottage has been serving the organization for over ten years. One of the original directors, Gary first heard of The Lending Cupboard through a personal tax client, in his work at Collins-Barrow.

"Don Laubman was a retired General," explains Gary. "When he tells you you're going to do something, you're going to do it!"

Kidding aside, Gary says he was intrigued by the concept of re-using equipment through a lending system, rather than everyone always having to buy new equipment. "I'm a big fan of libraries," he says. "Borrowing and returning books is a successful model, and this seemed to be an extension of that concept, which I thought was great." After the 2007 tax season ended, he attended his first board meeting, as an observer, and has been hooked ever since.

"We had quite a different reality back then," Gary reports. "The entire organization was completely volunteer run. Jacqui Joyce, our founder, wore a lot of hats, including that of unpaid Executive Director. We had limited equipment, no processes or systems in place, and half the space we have now."

He marvels at the community response; The Lending Cupboard lent equipment, in that first year, to more than 400 people. With the steady growth in demand, The Cupboard grew its space, secured some funding from Alberta Health Services, was able to hire staff and develop systems to facilitate efficient and effective work. "We still rely on our amazing volunteers," he points out. "That will never change. Volunteers are the lifeblood of our organization."

In recent years, The Cupboard has undertaken some intensive strategic planning, and conducted a Community Needs Assessment, to understand how to meet the increased demand and support other communities to replicate the model across the region and the country. The Lending Cupboard recently held its AGM, where new board members were elected. "It's great to see the interest and engagement from younger members of the community," he says. "They have fresh eyes, and bring re-invigoration to the organization. There's so much work yet to be done, but it's always exciting to see the growth. There are many challenges ahead, but those challenges represent opportunity. The need is there, and we are well-positioned to rise to the challenges."

A PRIMER ON HOME CARE

Did you know that, if you find yourself with a mobility challenge, whether through an injury, or a surgery, or advancing age, in addition to borrowing needed medical equipment from The Lending Cupboard, you can get home care support?

Home Care is a program operated by Alberta Health Services, developed for individuals with a valid Alberta Health card who require help with basic daily activities. "Depending on your needs, your care team may include a nurse, social worker, occupational therapist, [or] physiotherapist," states the home care page on the Alberta Health Services website.



Here's the basic process for accessing home care:

- 1. Call the Central Zone intake number at **1.855.371.4122** and **talk to the intake** worker about your needs;
- 2. A case manager will meet with you, in your home, to **assess your needs** and discuss what mobility aids you might also require;
- 3. The case manager will work with you to **create a plan of care** that may involve home care support;
- 4. If home care support is deemed to be warranted as part of your plan of care, you will begin to receive visits from home care workers, who may help with dressing, bathing and other personal hygiene, toileting, dining, mobilization and transfer, and medications.

This important support can help individuals with mobility or other health compromises to remain comfortably and safely in their own homes.

If you require medical equipment as part of your plan of care, your case manager will help you create a list of what you need; The Lending Cupboard team is always ready and able to help you with your medical equipment needs. All Lending Cupboard Society equipment is loaned out at no cost to residents of Central Alberta. Equipment is meant for use by individuals, living in private residences.
