We have seen a change in the physical layout of our facility, growth in our staff and volunteers as well as improved visibility in the community and the number of clients being served. It is a thrill for me to come to work every day. On Monday, Wednesday and Friday when we are open, the Cupboard is a buzz of activity, with a great group of people.

The last 11 months has seen over 14,000 pieces of equipment go through our loans program. At a rate of approximately 355 clients a month, we will exceed 4,000 individual people coming to The Lending Cupboard for support in our 2015-16 fiscal year. Our fundraising efforts have been successful and the individual donations have been growing also.

So what does that mean for the organization? As we come upon our 10 year anniversary, it is fitting that we take a look back at our history, examine the growth and prepare for the future. We started that in the fall with some strategic planning, and now we will be embarking on a Community Needs Assessment. This project will be key in providing our Board of Directors and myself with the information needed for evidence-based decision-making, which will set the stage for the next number of years for The Lending Cupboard. Stay tuned as we celebrate 10 years and set off on this exciting journey.
