# **TLC AMBASSADORS SHINE!**

If you've been anywhere near the Cupboard or its reading material over the last while, you no doubt know that a big thing is happening: The Cupboard is moving! The exciting upgrade to the new facility will expand the capacity of The Lending Cupboard so that it can continue to meet the demand in Central Alberta for the next decade.

The Spring Capital Campaign is a key part of the expansion project, in that financial and volunteer contributions are needed to ensure success. A committee has been formed to facilitate and execute the campaign. Some members of the campaign committee, who have personal stories of the impact that TLC has had on their lives and/or those of their loved ones, have been chosen to act as TLC Ambassadors. are a testament to the value and impact of Lending Cupboard services and the people that work here (staff and volunteers). These folks have a network in the community to which they represent The Cupboard and advocate for its needs. They are also available to speak to community groups, sharing their stories and love of The Cupboard.

## "So many people have been helped. If we all step up, we can get this done. People tell me they really value TLC, so I say I if you value it, then support it, and let's keep it going."

Two such individuals are Karol (Karl) Luciani and Lynn Wilson. Karl was the marketing director at Parkland Mall for 25 years, and then the Fund Development Coordinator at MS Society for 5 years. He developed an infection after hip surgery that left him as a paraplegic. Lynn served on the founding board of the organization 11 years ago and was also a volunteer at the Cupboard for some time. She had to step down when she was diagnosed with MS but has since been a client of The Cupboard. Both of them report that the two main drawings of The Lending Cupboard are the accessibility of the equipment to everyone in the community, regardless of economic standing, and the kindness of the volunteers.

Also, Lynn points out, "It's a very green operation because it is about recycling and upcycling equipment." Karl says: "TLC is essential for people to maintain their dignity and accessibility when they have an illness or injury."

# Sharing her Story 93 YEARS YOUNG "FARM GIRL" SPEAKS AT LADIES' LUNCHEON

Nellie Watson, who will turn 93 in September and still lives on her farm near Eckville, was a guest speaker at The Lending Cupboard's recent Ladies' Luncheon, telling the attendees what a privilege it was to be able to share her story of being a Cupboard Client.

"I'm on oxygen and have a little trouble with my legs," she reports, "but otherwise, I'm doing pretty well."

Nellie uses an aluminum walker that she borrowed from The Cupboard, saying she doesn't want one

with wheels because she "likes to exercise" her arms. "I ran a combine until I was 75," she says. "I did that for 40 years. Now my son, who lives a half mile away, does the farming, but I still try to stay active."

Nellie and her husband first came in contact with The Lending Cupboard when she had a fall a number of years ago. "At first, I thought all I had injured was my pride," she jokes, "but after about an hour, I realized that my ankle was really hurting."

It was the doctor who recommended that she turn to The Cupboard for support with either a crutch or cane or wheelchair during her recovery. "We were met by the kindest, most lovely smiling faces when we walked in," she says. "They were so helpful to us, and of course, there is no charge for the equipment. We were happy to make a donation."

Nellie volunteered for the MS Society for many years, as her son had MS. He passed in 1997, which was before TLC existed, "so we missed out on that opportunity for him, but are so grateful to have had access to it for my husband and for me."

Nellie's husband, who passed away in 2016, made use of several pieces of equipment in his final years. She says her brother and sister-in-law have also borrowed equipment from The Cupboard, as have many friends and neighbours.

The Ladies' Luncheon was a great opportunity to promote the wonderful work of The Cupboard, Nellie says. "If the ladies there feel as I do," she asserts, "they should all get behind it and support it; especially the Capital Campaign!

## Living with Mobility, Independence, and Dignity HITTING THE STREETS

Don't let mobility issues keep you cooped up inside. Borrowing equipment from The Lending Cupboard can help you live the full, active life you want. Last spring we shared some tips and tricks to help you get the most out of these all-too-short summer season. These are still good and relevant reminders, so here they are again:

## Ensure you are well rested

At this time of year, when it's light out late and early, it can be harder to get a full eight hours, but a good night's rest is just what's needed to avoid the fatigue the can impact reflexes and coordination. To improve your sleep, have some chamomile tea before bed. Keep your room dark and cool; try some lavender oil on your pillow.
